Bargain Bundle

This package offers conversion to ePub (supporting iPad, Sony, Kindle, Reader, and Nook) files; the Table of Contents is linked. Minimal number of elements (images, line art) no index or annotations.

Bargain Plus

This package offers the same options as the Basic Bundle plus index linking.

Premium Bundle

This package offers conversion to ePub (iPad, Sony, Kindle, Reader, and Nook), ePDF (read on computers) and XML (archival) files. Minimal number of elements (images, line art), no index or annotations, but Table of Contents is linked.

Premium Bundle Plus

This package offers the same options as the Premium Bundle plus index linking.

You may also choose to purchase single output files with or without linking the Table of Contents and/or the index.

PRICING:

eBook conversion pricing is based on the complexity of the files. The levels of complexity are defined below.

Simple - Table of Contents, minimal heads; no index, no annotations, minimal number of images, limited number of design elements. (Self-help, religious, simple trade)

Moderate - Table of Contents, minimal images (approx. 1/10 pg), simple tables; no insets. (Average trade with tables, images, moderate number of design elements)

Complex - Table of Contents, extensive annotations, line numbering, sidebars, intricate line spacing, moderate number of images, moderate tables. (Dummies-type title, reference, numerous design elements)

Translation of Non-English text for conversion from a scanned PDF file will carry a 30% surcharge. If the file is archived at M&G, there will be an unarchival fee as well.
